Anthropology/Public Health Dual Degree Program

(M.A./M.P.H or Ph.D./M.P.H.)

We collaborate with the USF College of Public Health to offer a dual degree program, in which students can earn an M.A. or Ph.D. in Applied Anthropology along with the Masters of Public Health (M.P.H.) in one of ten concentrations within Public Health, or the Ph.D. in Public Health, with an M.A. in Applied Anthropology. To complement this program, we offer a concentration in Biocultural Medical Anthropology in which students at both levels may choose to take courses that focus on this topic.

The two degree programs are coordinated in the following manner:

- To fulfill methods requirements in both programs, students may select either PHC 6050 Biostatistics I or ANG 5486 Quantitative Methods (M.A.)/ANG 7487 Advanced Quantitative Research Methods (Ph.D.)
- One external elective requirement for the degree in Anthropology is fulfilled by a Public Health course
- Public Health comprehensive examination requirement is met by completing ANG 6705 Foundations of Applied Anthropology with final grade of "B" or better
- In most cases, internship in a health-related field will dually fulfill M.P.H. requirement for Supervised Field Experience
- Dissertation or thesis in Anthropology dually fulfills M.P.H. requirement for PHC 6977 Special Project
